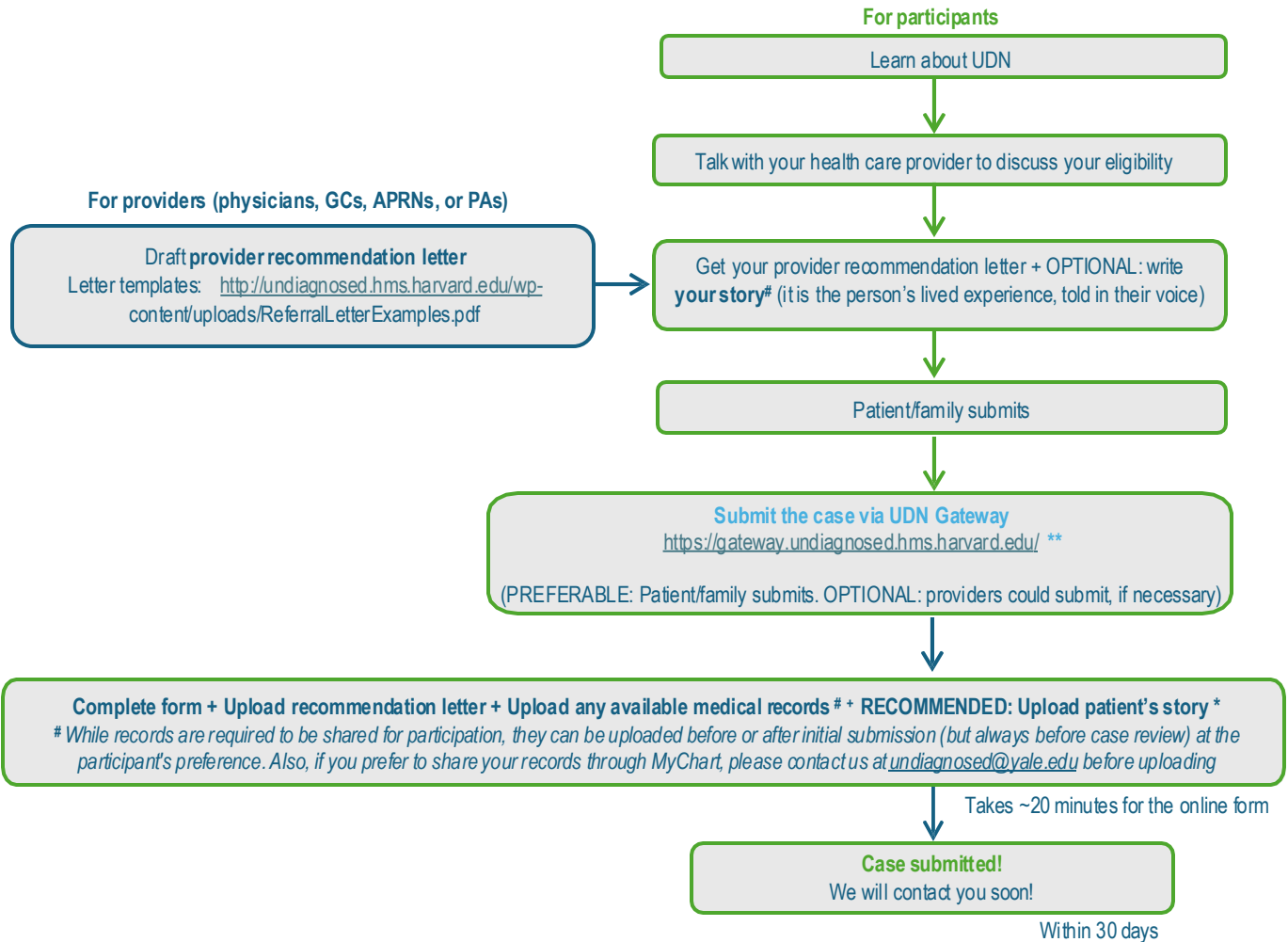

Its goal is to bring together medical and research specialists from across the United States to help solve the most difficult medical mysteries using the best and most advanced tools available. Through this study, we hope to support individuals and families living with undiagnosed conditions and learn more about how the human body works.

HOW TO SUBMIT A CASE AND WHAT TO EXPECT:



Short narrative (usually ½–1 page) written by the participant or family that describes: Symptoms in their own words | Timeline (what happened first, how things changed over time) | Daily impact on school, work, mobility, activities, emotions | What has been tried already (tests, treatments, responses) | What concerns the family the most | What they hope the UDN can help with | It is not a medical record.
