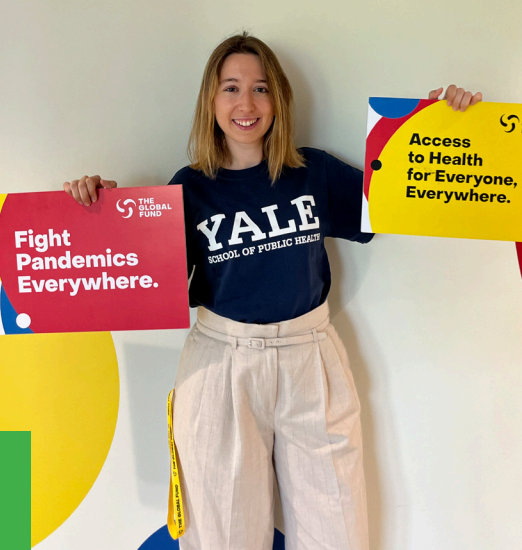
► EDUCATE GENERATIONS OF PUBLIC HEALTH LEADERS
